Zanesville Museum of Art and The Art Loft Opening Satellite Exhibition

ZANESVILLE, Ohio – The Zanesville Museum of Art and The Art Loft in downtown Zanesville are partnering once again to present a special satellite exhibition. The exhibition, an extension of the current ZMA exhibition Chicks with Balls | Judy Takács Paints Unsung Female Heroes, will be on view at The Art Loft during the First Friday Art Walk Friday, March 6. The exhibition will be on view at The Art Loft through March 26.

In her first solo museum exhibition, Cleveland-based artist Judy Takács offers a bold exploration of the female form. Since 2011, Takács has created an intrepid body of work celebrating womanhood and exploring the emotional trials and tribulations of extraordinary heroines. This exhibition helps introduce Takács' next series of works, The Goddess Project. The artist's triptych, Love Athena, will be on view for the first time at The Art Loft, which bridges the gap between Chicks with Balls and The Goddess Project.

This exhibition represents another installment in the relationship between the ZMA and The Art Loft. Two members of The Art Loft, Susan Nash and Susan Stubbins also sit on the museum's Board of Directors.

"We are really excited to have this exhibition and take on *The Goddess Project* here at The Art Loft," Susan Nash, Art Loft member, stated. "This exhibition is about female empowerment and we are thrilled to host that message at The Art Loft."

The Art Loft will also be hosting a lecture by Judy Takács about her next project on March 19. Takács will be signing her Chicks with Balls books at both events.
