### Rembrandt is Coming to the Zanesville Museum of Art

ZANESVILLE, Ohio–Rembrandt | The Consummate Etcher and Other 17th Century Printmakers opens October 25 in the ZMA's Great Gallery. Rembrandt is generally considered one of the most significant figures in western art history due in part to his virtuoso style, the variety of his subject matter, and the sheer volume of work he produced in his fifty-year career as a painter, draughtsman, and printmaker. This exhibition brings together many of Rembrandt's most significant prints and those created by several of his contemporaries, all of whom were active during a period called the Dutch Golden Age—a period marked by tremendous economic growth and artistic achievement.

"This is a rare opportunity to view remarkable original masterpieces by Rembrandt in Zanes-ville," said ZMA Executive Director Laine Snyder. "The works are dramatic and speak to the concerns of everyday people."

Arranged thematically, the images in this special exhibition explore key topics that inspired artists of the 17th century including landscapes, scenes of everyday life—or genre scenes—portraiture, and religion. The works also demonstrate the artists' preference for a specific type of printmaking process called etching, a process that resembled the immediacy of sketching on paper, required less technical training than the woodcut or engraving printmaking processes, and yielded multiple impressions from each etching plate.

This exhibition includes works on loan from the Syracuse University Art Collection, the Zanesville Museum of Art's permanent collection, and from the Mr. Carl E. Eriksson collection. The installation of this exhibition will take place at the museum beginning October 8 and ending October 19. Exhibition support is generously provided by Dr. Robert and Mrs. Susan Thompson and the Ohio Arts Council. This exhibition is organized by the Syracuse University Art Galleries.
